# **UNM Sports History Graduate Fellowship**

for the 2017-2018 Academic Year  
(20 hours per week)

## **The UNM Sports History Digital Initiative**

The UNM Sports History initiative is a new digital initiative sponsored by the Center for Southwest Research and the University Libraries Digital Initiatives and Scholarly Communication (DISC) group.

## **Fellowship Duties and Responsibilities**

Fellows participate in the creation of original UNM sports history content which will be published on the New Mexico's Digital Collections website ([econtent.unm.edu](http://econtent.unm.edu)). Duties will include digitizing audiovisual recordings of UNM games and uploading them to library public websites with text documentation of the sports events. Fellows may also create social media content and participate in oral history interviews and presentations or public events about the project.

## **Terms of the Award**

The award is for \$15,000 for the 2017-2018 Academic Year. The fellow will work 20 hours per week during the fall and spring semesters: August 21 to December 16, 2017, and January 15 to May 12, 2018. Fellows must be enrolled in at least 6 credit hours each semester.

## **Fellowship Requirements**

Applicants for the UNM Sports History Graduate Fellowship must meet the following minimum requirements:

- Good writing, communication, organization and time management skills.
- Experience using Microsoft Windows and Microsoft Office.
- Legally authorized to work in the United States.

In addition, applicants that have knowledge or skills in at least one of the following areas will be given preferred consideration:

- Sports interest or knowledge, particularly of football, baseball and basketball
- Knowledge of UNM sports history
- Skills in graphic arts, web authoring, or web design

# Application Requirements

1. A letter of application listing your contact information, current academic GPA, and a description of your qualifications.
2. Your current Résumé or Curriculum Vitae.
3. Xeroxed or unofficial copies of your college transcripts.
4. Two letters of reference from individuals who are familiar with your academic or work experience.
5. Apply by June 30, 2017 for best consideration.
