APPLICATION CATEGORY	SPECIFIC INSTRUCTIONS
Educational Background	VERY IMPORTANT: Under "Most Recent College/University" list your bachelor's degree information, even if that is not the most recent school you've attended. In the first "Other College/University" field, list your Graduate school information, if you have any. IF NOT, skip to the second "Other College/University" field and list any other College/University information you have.
Program of Interest	Select: College of Arts and Sciences> Psychology> Psychology> PhD Psychology. Next, you will choose an area of interest: CBB, Clinical, Developmental, or Evolutionary. You may choose a second area under Second Interest. Finally, in the Faculty Member Preference box, choose at least one but up to three faculty members you wish to work with, and please list them in order of preference.
Test Scores	The GRE-General Test scores (Quantitative, Verbal, Analytical) are required. The Psychology Subject Test is required for applicants to the Clinical area; it is strongly recommended for the other areas, especially for applicants who do not hold a degree in psychology. The Institution Code for UNM is 4845, the subject code is not necessary.
Letter of Intent	Your Letter of Intent/Statement of Purpose should describe your goals, research interests, research experience, and how they fit with your chosen faculty mentor(s).
Writing Sample	This is optional. You may submit a writing sample that documents your research interests, and that showcases your research and writing abilities. Some applicants have told us they are required by the application to submit something so if you are not submitting a writing sample, and are unable to continue past this field, feel free to upload a blank sheet of paper.
CV/Resume	This is a required document.
Recommendations	At least three letters of recommendation are required; two of these should be from former professors.
