APPLICATION CATEGORY	SPECIFIC INSTRUCTIONS
Program of Interest	<p>Select: College of Arts and Sciences > Anthropology > Anthropology</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> List 1-3 department faculty with whom you wish to work. Specify area (Southwest, Africa, Andes, etc.) and/or topic (e.g., human-environment interactions, women and health, linguistics, etc.) of interest. Select Archaeology, Ethnology, Evolutionary Anthropology, or Public Archaeology. For archaeologists unsure whether to apply for Archaeology or Public Archaeology, choose Archaeology if your ultimate goal is the PhD; choose Public Archaeology if your goal is a Master's Degree. <p>Additional interests are optional.</p> <p>If you wish to be considered for Museum Research Traineeship, please write "MRT" as an additional interest.</p>
Test Scores	<p>GREs are not required for admission by any Anthropology program. However, each subfield has its own policy in regards to GRE scores:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Archaeology: GRE scores are optional, but not required Ethnology: GRE scores are not accepted, but a writing sample is required Evolutionary Anthropology: The GRE is not required for application or admittance to the program. However, students who feel that their GRE scores will be helpful in evaluating their overall academic record are welcome to submit them. Public Archaeology: GRE scores are optional, but not required <p>If Anthropology applicants decide to take the exam, take the General GRE (not a subject test). International students must take the TOEFL or equivalent as accepted by the UNM Global Education Office.</p>
Letter of Intent	Required. No special instructions.
Writing Sample	Required for Ethnology applicants; optional for applicants to all other programs.
CV/Resume	Optional. No special instructions.
Assistantship Interest	Students who wish to be considered for Museum Research Traineeship (https://mrt.unm.edu) should upload a statement of ~350 words describing the relationship between their research interests and the MRT program.
Recommendations	Three letters of recommendation are required. Academic letters strongly suggested.
