

Graduate Studies Faculty Fellow

Graduate Studies seeks a tenured (associate or full) professor to serve in residence as a Faculty Fellow for the Fall 2022 semester. The Fellow will work in a coordinating capacity with three student-centered mentoring and research programs in Graduate Studies: [the Faculty Mentoring Program](#); the [Dr. Glenda Lewis Critical Race Scholars Awards](#); and [the Shared Knowledge Conference](#). The fellow will be provided office space in Graduate Studies and is expected to hold office hours once a week related to the above programming. The named Fellow will also be invited to participate in campus-wide, research-related graduate programming, such as the Grand Challenges events and Research and Discovery Week.

Qualified applicants must:

1. Be at the rank of associate or full professor;
2. Have a demonstrable record of successful graduate student service, teaching, research; advising; or mentoring;
3. Have a demonstrable record of a commitment to equity, inclusion, diversity, and educational excellence at the graduate level;
4. Be able to work with graduate students across colleges, disciplines, and graduate degree levels (MA, MFA, PhD);
5. Be familiar with graduate student policies and procedures as outlined in the UNM Catalog and the Faculty Handbook.

Terms:

The Faculty Fellow will serve for the Fall 2022 academic semester. Non-standard payment of \$7,000.00 will be allocated in December 2022, at end of the term. The selected Fellow will report directly to the Acting Dean of Graduate Studies.
